

## January Scholarship Deadlines

### John F Kennedy Profile in Courage Essay Contest

**Eligibility:** The contest is open to United States high school students in grades nine through twelve attending public, private, parochial, or home schools. Essays can be no more than 1,000 words but must be a minimum of 700 words. Citations and bibliography are not included in the word count. Essays must be the original work of the student. Essays must describe an act of political courage by a U.S. elected official who served during or after 1917, the year John F. Kennedy was born.

**Due:** January 18th 2019

**Amount:** Varies \$100-\$10,000

### Pride Foundation Scholarship

**Eligibility:** Pride Foundation and The Greater Seattle Business Association (GSBA) award scholarships to build leadership and promote diversity in the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and ally communities. Scholarships may be used for any post-secondary education including non-traditional degrees, trade or technical programs, community colleges, four-year public and private universities, and accredited certificate programs.

### GE- Reagan Foundation Scholarship Program

**Eligibility:** Student must demonstrate at school, at the workplace, and within the community the attributes of leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship;

- demonstrate strong academic performance (minimum 3.0 grade point average/4.0 scale or equivalent);
- be citizens of the United States of America;

- be current high school seniors attending high school in the United States (students living on U.S. Armed Forces base and homeschooled students are also eligible); and
- plan to enroll in a full-time undergraduate course of study toward a bachelor's degree at an accredited four-year college or university in the United States for the entire upcoming academic year.

### Technology Addiction Awareness Scholarship

**Eligibility:** You must be a high school freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior or a current or entering college or graduate school student of any level. Home schooled students are also eligible. There is no age limit. You must also be a U.S. citizen or legal resident. Complete the application form including a 140-character message about technology addiction.

#### Idaho Angus Auxiliary Scholarship

**Eligibility:** The Contest is open to all United States citizens or legal residents who are students who are no older than 19 and no younger than 14 as of the end of the Contest Period who (1) attend school in the United States, one of its territories or districts, or an American Armed Forces School Abroad, and (2) who are in grades 8 -12 attending public, private, religious, or charter schools, or (3) are enrolled in a GED or correspondence school program, or (4) are attending a home school program.

**Society of Women Engineers: Southwest Idaho Section**

**Eligibility:** Engineering or engineering-related fields such as computer science or hard sciences. Open to any female from Idaho entering her freshman year of college. Selection based on essay response, academic accomplishments with emphasis on math and science, recommendation from a high school math or science teacher, and extracurricular activities and accomplishments.
